5 EXIT SLIPS TO HELP YOU SURVIVE THE LAST 5 MINUTES OF ANY LESSON

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INTRODUCTION

Exit slips are easy to implement and a powerful way to formatively assess students at the end of a lesson. They provide immediate feedback on the effectiveness of your instruction, allowing you to adapt to the needs of your students. This kit was created to give you simple and versatile exit slips that you can use to SURVIVE the last five minutes of your next class.

USING EXIT SLIPS WILL ENABLE YOU TO:

- Assess Student Learning
- Modify Instruction
- Target Interventions
- Reflect on Teaching

HOW TO USE THIS SURVIVAL KIT:

As you probably already know, teaching is a well planned but unpredictable endeavor. In order for any tool to be effective, it should be able to be used at a moment's notice. When there is a room full of students staring you down and you have to make the next move, you need to be ready.

In order to maximize the use of this kit, it is recommended that you choose some or all of the provided exit slips and print class sets. Keep these in the front of your room where they can be easily accessed on those days where you are concerned your students didn't grasp a concept, you want to see where they are with a topic, or you are surprised by a visit from your administrator. Simply hand out the ready-to-go exit slips and collect them to assess student learning quickly and effectively. Each of the provided exit slips is meant to be used and graded quickly to save time and allow you to focus on what matters: teaching.

YOUR SURVIVAL KIT CONTENTS:

EXIT SLIP #1 - ARE YOU FEELING IT?

This exit slip allows students to show their understanding and articulate how they feel about a particular topic or lesson. This will help you understand how confident they are about what they have learned and what they think they still need some help on.



> EXIT SLIP #2 - DRAW IT OUT!

This exit slip allows students to use creative and artistic skills to draw a concept or idea that was discussed during class. This can be chosen by you or the students, depending on your needs.



EXIT SLIP #3 - COMPARE & CONTRAST

This exit slip provides students with the opportunity to compare and contrast two chosen topics provided by you. They are required to explain the differences and the similarities in a simple graphic organizer.



EXIT SLIP #4 - WHAT STUCK WITH YOU?

This is a great exit slip to utilize when you only have a minute or two. It prompts students to quickly explain a few topics or concepts they understood from the lesson.



EXIT SLIP #5 - 2 TRUTHS AND 1 LIE

This exit slip allows students to share two things they learned from the lesson that are true. This activity also has the students write down one false statement and explain why it is not true. This will challenge learners and show comprehension of a topic through corrective actions. NAME: CLASS: DATE:




